SF green job forum overflowed



Tuesday, January 27, 2009

SAN FRANCISCO

The INFORUM program, which targets people in their 20's and 30's and never sells out, had every age group show up Monday night. The Commonwealth Club created an overflow area and still had to turn people away.

345 people were sitting and standing in the main room and there were more listening outside. About 50 people didn't get in and had to be turned away.

"It was kind of like a rock concert. You really needed to show up early to get in there. Pretty much to be expected in this economy," said Sloan Wilson, from San Francisco.

Once the crowd was dealt with, the panel got right to it listing what types of green jobs are out there. The list wasn't exactly glamorous, but the panelists did talk about how fast this industry is growing and offered plenty of advice. For instance, don't show up and say you've got 15 years marketing experience and you're ready to go green, without studying the carbon lingo.

"Find out about the industry. If you want to look at solar then join your local association like the Northern California Solar Energy Association. It's cheap. They meet regularly. It's low key," said Peter Beadle, the CEO of Green Jobs.com.








Declining Cost of Deploying Solar

Solar Energy Capacity Growth (U.S.)








Green/Climate Job Boards

Introduction

- In some instances employers may not publicize a job opportunity via a traditional job board.
- This could be due to reasons such as capacity (for example, a startup may not have a complete human resources department).
- Strategies and sources to locate some of these "hidden climate jobs" are discussed in this section.

Strategy 1: Go Direct

- Some organizations may publish job listings on their website, but not utilize the job boards described in the previous section.
- To access these opportunities job seekers should identify organizations they would be interested in working for and review the Jobs or Careers section of their website for potential jobs.
- Strategies to identify organizations are listed on the next slides.

- 1. Take time to **make a list of organizations** you are interested in working for.
- 2. Review materials (such as directories) from **industry associations**.
- 3. Review the list of **exhibitors** or presenters at industry conferences.
- 4. Review national or local lists and **directories of sustainable businesses**.
- 5. **Follow the news**, such as industry publications, newsletters, social media feeds, etc.).


- One method to identify potential future green





A new analysis commissioned by the BlueGreen Alliance from the Political Economy Research Institute (PERI) at the University of Massachusetts Amherst finds that the more than 100 climate, energy, and environmental investments in the Inflation Reduction Act will create more than 9 million good jobs over the next decade—an average of nearly 1 million jobs each year. That includes more than 6 million jobs created over the next 10 years by grants, loans, and tax credits and nearly 3 million jobs stimulated by new loan guarantee authority for the U.S. Department of Energy. The bill's broad investments will also help sustain the millions of existing jobs in the clean economy.








